Non-Patient Service Drives Hospitals

HOSPITAL CENSUS HIGHLIGHTS

- n The hospitals in our 2011 census logged an average of 87,835 patient days last year and purchased \$1.52 million worth of food. They operated, on average, with a staff of 54 FTEs.
- n 78% of the respondents represented self-operated foodservice programs.
- n Once again, the majority of foodservice revenue comes from non-patient meals, with respondents reporting an average of **53%** of revenue-**\$1.02 million**-coming from retail sources and catered functions. The average number of daily cash transactions was 1,335.
- n Patient meal counts rose in 26% of the hospitals surveyed, decreased in 20% and remained static in 54%. In hospitals that offer non-patient feeding, retail meal counts rose in 37%, counts fell in 13% and remained steady
- ${f n}$ 68% of hospitals plan to budget an increase in food purchases in the coming year, while only 6% expect the amount of their food purchases to drop. For those expecting food costs to increase, the average projected
- n 38% of respondents say they offer on-demand room service for patients, with hospitals in the West much less likely to provide such service; only 18% of facilities in that geographic area do, compared with 44% in the remainder of the U.S. 90% of hospitals that offer on-demand room service make it available to all patient units.
- n **52%** of hospitals offer some form of cashless payment system for employee meals.
- n 82% of hospitals use a group purchasing organization for at least some of their foodservice purchases.

SPENDING MORE IN THE **HEARTLAND**

More hospital foodservice programs in the midsection of the country expect to increase the amount of money they spend on food purchases next year. The breakdown, by geographic area:




BUYING LOCAL ...

Unique to hospital foodservice is the fact that dairy is the item purchased locally by the largest percentage of institutions. In all other segments, produce is the item most often bought locally. What hospitals say they buy, by product category:
