FSD's 2010 **School District** Report

FoodService Director's 2010 School District Census is a snapshot of the K-12 schools market, based on information supplied by 50 large, medium and small districts.



Food cost for lunch, including commodities, averaged \$1.62 among the surveyed schools, a dramatic increase over last year's cost of \$1.43. The average food cost for breakfast was 89 cents, compared with 82 cents last year, and 47 cents-up from 43 cents-for after-school **HIGHLIGHTS:**

- On average, 51% of the students attending the schools in the census qualify for either free or reduced-
- 48% of the districts in the census-the same percentage as last year-operate a summer feeding program. However, the average number of meals per day rose markedly, to about 15,900, compared with only 7,900 meals per day last year.
- 84% of the districts surveyed say they offer vending, but in only 43% of those schools does the foodservice department have full or partial control over vending. In those districts, vending generates an average of \$63,400 in annual revenue.
- Of the 92% of districts serving breakfast, more serve it in the classroom than last year, with 41% offering this service. Only 37% of districts in our survey last year offered this service. Among those that do, on average 17% of breakfasts served to elementary students, 10% to middle school students and 7% to high school students are eaten in a classroom.
- 88% of districts surveyed say they offer students and parents a cashless payment option. In those districts, an average of 63% of meals are purchased using the cashless option.
- The larger the district, the more likely it is to be unionized; 52% of districts have union employees, and the average number of schools in those districts is 136. The average size of a non-unionized district in the survey is 17. Continued on p. 14

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
